Barriers to Planning

- Anxiety about mortality
- Unaware of options and opportunities
- Lack of resources and options
- Afraid to "burden" siblings





Siblings Role in Future Planning





- Identify concerns and share
- Gather helpful information
- Advocate for services and supports
- Network with other siblings and families

- Talk to your parents and sibling(s)
- Think about your role
- Think about the people who should be part of the conversation
